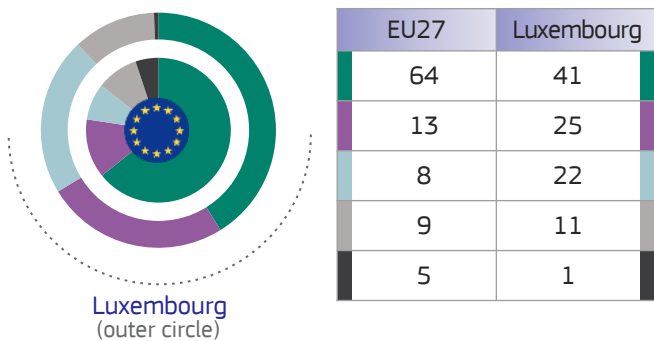

1 Intention to vote in the 2024 European elections

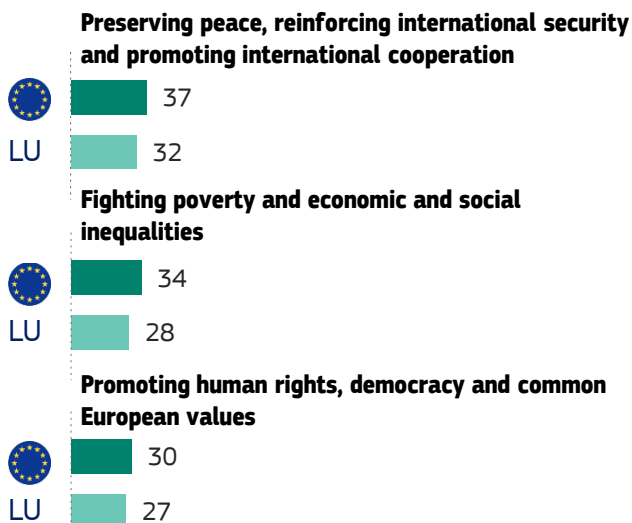
Q13. Do you intend to vote in the upcoming European elections? (%)

- Prefer not to answer

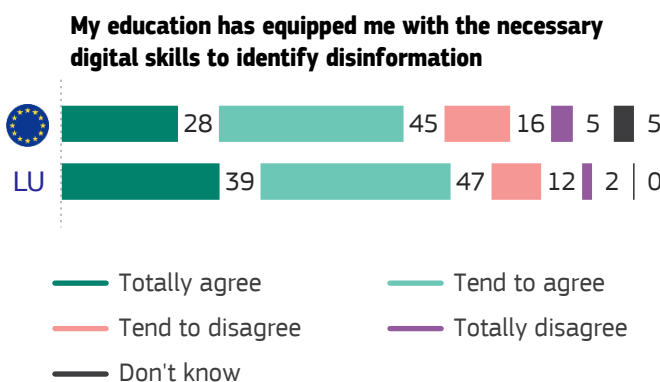
2 Youth's expectation from the EU

Q12. What do you expect of the European Union for your generation? You can select up to three answers. (% Top 3 responses)



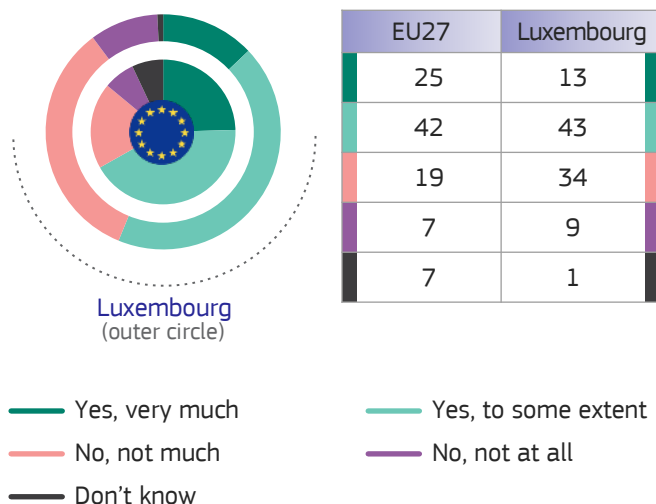
3 Digital skills and identifying disinformation

Q18. To what extent do you agree or disagree with the following statement? (%)



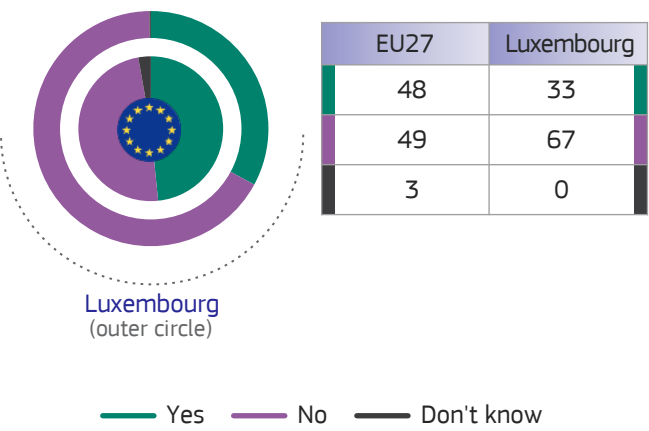
4 Impact of EU actions on daily life

Q11. Would you say that actions taken by the EU have an impact on your daily life or not? (%)



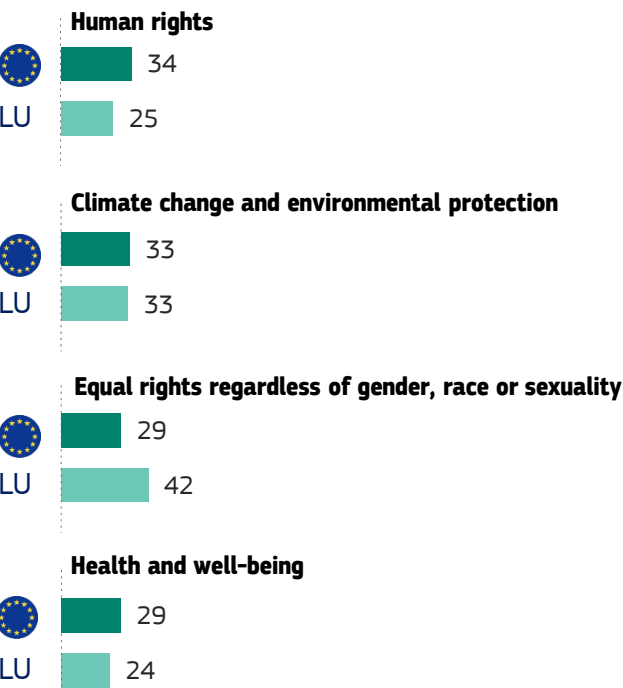
5 Civic engagement and societal change

Q4a. In the past year, have you taken any action to change society by, for example, signing a petition, participating in a rally, or sending a letter to a politician? (%)



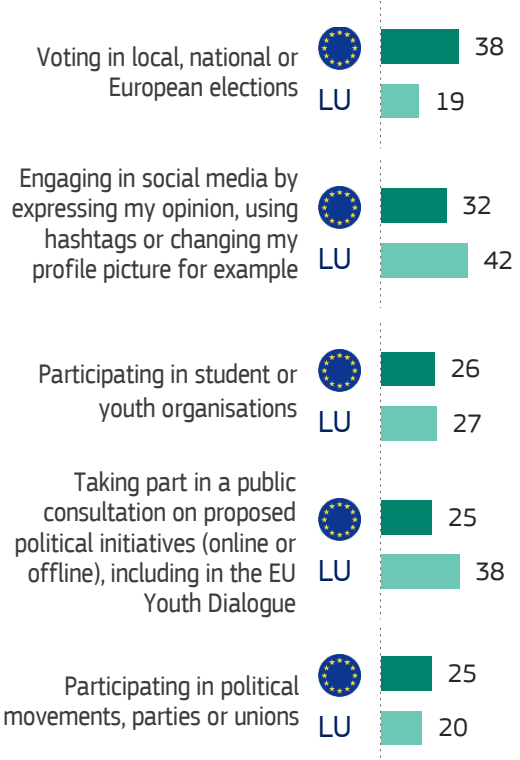
Q4b. In which areas did you try to change society (by, for example, signing a petition, participating in a rally, or sending a letter to a politician)? (% Top 4 responses)
